

## Gathering FRIENDS

he theme for discussion in February is "Friendship." For Salvationists who may have been extremely busy with kettles and Angel Tree, they may have missed out on times of connection that others had during the holidays. February may be an important time to reconnect and to make an effort to spend time together. For those who were able to hop from party to party, time to actually sit down and have a deep conversation may be quite appreciated. Make an extra effort to contact those who may have had trouble making it to a January get-together.

This month as you prepare for Gathering, it will be great for you to spend some time thinking about Jesus' relationships with his friends as we find in the New Testament and in our own lives. You may wish to introduce a fifth question to your group this month:

"You are My friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you slaves, for the slave does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I have heard from My Father I have made known to you." (*John 15:14-15*) What does this mean to you? How do you understand friendship with Jesus?

If you choose to use this question, it is important to recognize that this remains a time of conversation and not a class. The questions are worded to help people figure out how to explain meaning – not to produce a doctrinally airtight response. All our words are insufficient to describe God.

Use at least four of the questions below for your group:

- What are the qualities you value in a friend and why?
- Have you ever had to end a friendship and how did you know?
- Do you seek out new friends? Should you? What makes it hard? What makes it easy?
- Tell us a fun friend story.
- What was a time in your life when it felt hard to find a real friend?


