

Generosity

e have all heard that it is "better to give than to receive," and I think that most of us know how great it feels to give something to someone that they will truly appreciate. What we don't realize, however, is that our generosity with others has greater benefits than feeling good about doing something nice for someone else. The secret benefit of giving is that it is good for us!

- 1. Giving makes us feel happy. Giving money or doing acts of kindness give us a feeling known as the "*helper's high*."
- 2. Giving is good for our health. It helps decrease stress and seems to lower blood pressure, which gives lots of benefit to our bodies!
- 3. Giving promotes cooperation and social connection. When you give to others, it is likely to be rewarded by someone down the line, and this strengthens our ties to others.
- 4. Giving evokes gratitude. This is true for both the giver and the receiver!
- 5. Giving is contagious. It inspires others to behave generously.

Even though we know that it is good to be generous, and that Scripture affirms that Christians should be a giving people, sometimes it is incredibly difficult to make that ambition a reality. When we are asked to give, we hesitate. We may feel afraid of what might happen if we make a sacrifice by choosing to give. We ask ourselves, "What if I need this later? What if I don't have enough because I gave this away?"

Beyond our fears, we live in a culture that emphasizes that we should be getting more than we're giving, and it can be hard to resist the urge to want something new or better instead of being satisfied with what we already own. When we focus on what we want, it makes it much harder to be generous in our giving.

Instead of clinging to our fears and hesitations about giving, let us instead take to heart God's Promise from Psalm 112:5a: "Good comes to all who are gracious and share freely."




