What is your favorite book to read while sipping hot chocolate?


Where is the most unusual or unique place you've enjoyed hot chocolate?

chocolate fun facts

- ▲ It takes 400 cocoa beans to make one pound of chocolate.
- **▲** Each cacao tree produces approximately 2,500 beans.
- ▲ Chocolate comes from a fruit tree; it's made from a seed.
- ▲ Most cocoa−70 percent–hails from West Africa.
- ▲ Cocoa is raised by hand, on small, family–owned farms
- ▲ It takes two to four days to make a single–serving chocolate bar.
- ▲ Hershey's Kisses got their name from the kissing sound the machine that deposits the chocolate on the conveyor belt makes.
- ▲ The inventor of the chocolate chip cookie, Ruth Wakefield, sold her cookie recipe to Nestle in exchange for a lifetime supply of chocolate.
- ▲ Chocolate milk is an effective post–workout recovery drink.
- ▲ The Brussels Airport is the biggest chocolate seller in the world, as vendors there sell more than 800 tons of chocolate every year.
