t Christmastime, one way we think of glory in association with the fantastical shining light of the angel that appeared to the shepherds in Luke 2. The shepherds can't help but be terrified at the grand and awe-inspiring sight of the angel that brought the message of Jesus' birth. But then the sky was filled with a host of angels singing their praises to God for the joyous moment of salvation that had finally come. It was a magnificent sight, and the shepherds were overwhelmed as God's glory was revealed to them!

We hope and pray for these moments, for the glory of the Lord revealed to us in great and wonderful ways. These are the moments that we share with others in our testimonies – I can imagine the shepherds excitedly telling everyone about the glorious sight of the angels!

When we keep reading further in Luke 2, past the encounter with the angels, the next appearance of the Lord's glory is recorded in quite a different way. After the baby Jesus was born, Mary and Joseph took Him to the temple. Simeon, described as a righteous and devout man, took the baby Jesus into his arms. There was no heavenly angel choir, no shining light, nothing to cause fear and trembling; however, in this little baby Simeon recognized what most others never would have seen. Simeon immediately gave praise to God because he had seen in this child the ultimate demonstration of the Glory of God.

During this Christmas season, may our eyes, too, be just as open to seeing the glory of God revealed to us in the subtler ways. Read together these verses from Luke 2:30-32 and answer the following questions to reflect on God's glory. "For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."





