The role of the Community Care Ministries worker is to provide compassionate, practical support to others.

SUGGESTIONS

- Visit the sick – isolated – and the elderly.

- Read to a child – share a hobby.
- Phone someone who is lonely – be part of a Telephone Reassurance Ministry.
- Bring comfort – encouragement and material aid where needed.
- Drive someone to the store or doctor's office.
- Write letters for the incapacitated – send cards for birthdays or holidays.
- Bake a cake – prepare meals for the sick or bereaved.
- Help an elderly person with minor maintenance or gardening.
- Play the piano or any instrument at a nursing home or for a shut-in.
- Get involved with 'pet therapy' at nursing homes and hospitals.
- Use your own ideas! Be creative! Be caring!
